# **Employment in Jackson County: November 2022** Health Care and Social Assistance Add Most Jobs over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County increased by 170 jobs in November. The largest decline was estimated in construction which lost 150 jobs. Other sectors losing jobs over the month were leisure and hospitality (-40), financial activities (-30), and professional and business services (-20). Local government education added 200 jobs in November as school year hiring continued. Other industries with estimated job gains included transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+80); retail trade (+60); and private education and health services (+50).

Over the past year payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) gained 1,440 jobs, an increase of 1.6%. Jackson County is now 1,470 jobs below the November 2019 prepandemic total. Since November 2021, industries adding jobs included health care and social assistance (+910), leisure and hospitality (+420), construction (+370), and wholesale trade (+80). Retail trade (-740), professional and business services (-80), and financial activities (-60) lost jobs over the year.

Government employment rose by 520 jobs over the year. Local government education had an estimated increase of 400 jobs and state government employment rose by 50. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.7% which was equal to the November 2021 rate and up slightly from 4.3% in October 2022.

#### Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
