Employment in Josephine County: October 2022 Josephine County Recovers from Pandemic Job Losses

Total payroll employment in Josephine County increased by 120 jobs in October. Local government education had the largest gain over the month, up by 80 jobs. Leisure and hospitality employment fell by 40 jobs in October. Private education and health services added 60 jobs and employment rose by 20 in retail trade. Government employment had a net gain of 70 jobs with the increase in local government education slightly offset by a loss of 20 jobs in federal government and 10 jobs lost in state government.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) increased by 660 jobs, a gain of 2.4%. Those job gains leave the county now 90 jobs above the October 2019 pre-pandemic total. Industries adding jobs since October 2021 included private education and health services (+310); leisure and hospitality (+260); and construction (+190). Smaller job increases were estimated in manufacturing (+90) and information (+30). Industries losing jobs over the year were professional and business services (-150); retail trade (-120); and wholesale trade (-20).

Government employment was up by 50 jobs over the year. A gain of 80 jobs in local government education was offset by a loss of 30 jobs in state government. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.5%, up slightly from 5.3% in October 2021.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the November county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Dec. 20th, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for November on Wednesday, Dec. 14^{th.}

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
