Employment in Josephine County: January 2023 Josephine County Recovers from Pandemic Job Losses

Total payroll employment in Josephine County fell by 250 jobs in January. Private-sector industries with estimated job losses included retail trade (-70); construction (-40); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-30); professional and business services (-30); and leisure and hospitality (-30). Private education and health services was the only industry to have a notable gain in employment, up by 90 jobs in January. Government employment fell by 130, mostly resulting from a loss of 110 in local government education.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) increased by 730 jobs, a gain of 2.7%. Those job gains leave the county now 180 jobs above the January 2020 pre-pandemic total. Industries adding jobs since January 2022 included private education and health services (+340), leisure and hospitality (+280), manufacturing (+100), financial activities (+80), and other services (+50). Industries losing jobs over the year were professional and business services (-190) and construction (-50).

Government employment rose by 90 jobs over the year. A gain of 40 jobs both in local government education and local government excluding educational services, and 10 jobs added in state government accounted for the yearly gain.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the February county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, March 28th, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for February on Tuesday, March 21st.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
