Employment in Josephine County: February 2024 Retail Trade, and Leisure and Hospitality Have Largest Job Declines Over the Year

Total payroll employment in Josephine County rose by 30 jobs in February, with little change over the month in most industries. Construction added 20 jobs over the month but had essentially no change over the year. Retail trade was the only other published industry to show slight change, down by 20 jobs in February. Government employment was essentially flat over the month as well.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) slipped by 100 jobs, a decrease of -0.4%. Industries adding jobs since February 2023 included private education and health services (+310), and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+10). Industries with estimated losses were retail trade (-160), leisure and hospitality (-110), professional and business services (-70), other services (-60), manufacturing (-50), wholesale trade (-50).

Government employment rose by 90 jobs over the year. Local government (+40), federal government (+40), and state government (+10) all added jobs since February 2023. Josephine County payroll employment is now 670 jobs below the February 2020 total prior to the pandemic.

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 4.1% in February, edging up from 3.9% in January and down from the February 2023 rate of 5.2%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the March county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, April 23rd, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for March on Wednesday, April 17th.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
