## **Employment in Josephine County: March 2024** Leisure and Hospitality, and Government Add Jobs

Total payroll employment in Josephine County rose by 120 jobs in March to reach 26,760. Job gains were estimated in leisure and hospitality (+50), and professional and business services (+20). Government employment climbed by 60 jobs over the month. Local government education (+30), federal government (+20), and state government (+10) all saw an uptick in jobs counts in March. Other published industries showed little change in job totals.

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) slipped by 170 jobs, a decrease of 0.6%. Industries adding jobs since March 2023 included private education and health services (+290), and mining and logging (+20). Industries with estimated losses were retail trade (-130), leisure and hospitality (-80), professional and business services (-80), other services (-70), manufacturing (-70), and wholesale trade (-60).

Government employment rose by 80 jobs over the year. Federal government (+40), local government (+30), and state government (+10) added jobs since March 2023.

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.5% in March, unchanged from February and down from the March 2023 rate of 6.0%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the April county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, May 21<sup>st</sup>, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for April on Wednesday, May 15<sup>th</sup>.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
