Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA)

Lane County's Unemployment Rate Edges up to 4.3% in October

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up to 4.3% in October compared with a revised 4.1% in September. Lane County's record low rate was 3.6% in November 2019. The rate is down from 4.6% in October 2021. The Oregon seasonally adjusted October rate was 4.1% and the U.S. rate was 3.7% in October.

Lane County's payroll employment increased a seasonally adjusted 500 jobs in October after an increase of 400 in September and a decrease of 300 in August. The county has regained 89% of the jobs lost in March and April 2020 at the onset of the COVID-19 crisis.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in October, there was a large gain in leisure and hospitality of 600. There were additional gains of 100 each in construction, financial activities, education and health services, and other services. There was a loss of 100 in professional and business services.


Government gained 1,500 jobs in October due mostly to a seasonal gain in local education.

When comparing October 2022 with October 2021, total nonfarm employment is up a seasonally adjusted 5,500 jobs, or 3.5%. Most major not seasonally adjusted industry sectors are up over the year, with education and health services (2,000), leisure and hospitality (1,800), professional and business services (1,000) and construction (600) adding the most. There were losses of 400 each in retail trade and government.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
