Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA)

Lane County's Unemployment Rate Edges up to 4.9% in January

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate edged up to 4.9% in January compared with a revised 4.8% in December. The rate is higher than the 4.5% recorded in January 2022. Lane County's record low rate was 3.6% in February 2019. The Oregon seasonally adjusted January rate was 4.8% and the U.S. rate was 3.4%.

Lane County's payroll employment increased a seasonally adjusted 600 jobs in January after increases of 1,000 in December and 400 in November. Benchmark adjustments for 2022 show that annual average total payroll employment was 2,400 (-1.5%) jobs lower than originally estimated. With the adjustment, the county has regained 80% of the jobs lost in March and April 2020 at the onset of the COVID-19 crisis.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in January, there were seasonal losses in retail trade (-800); construction (-200); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-200). There was an additional loss of 500 in professional and business services. There was a gain in leisure and hospitality of 400.

Government lost 400 jobs in January due to a loss of 400 in local education.


When comparing January 2023 with January 2022, total nonfarm employment is up a seasonally adjusted 2,000 jobs, or 1.3%. Most major not seasonally adjusted industry sectors are up over the year, with leisure and hospitality (1,500), manufacturing (500), and financial activities (500) adding the most.

There was a loss of 400 in government attributed to a loss of 400 in local government education.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
