Employment in Albany MSA (Linn County): February 2024

Linn County's Unemployment Rate Increases to 4.4%

Linn County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.4% in February, up from its revised rate of 4.1% in January. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in February was 4.2%, edging up from its revised January rate of 4.1%.

Linn County's employment gains in February were more than normal; total nonfarm employment increased by 220 jobs, when employment would be expected to increase 70 jobs. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased by 150 jobs between January and February. Employment is now 1.5%, or 720 jobs, above the pre-pandemic employment level in February 2020.

Linn County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment was up 10 (+0.0%) over the past year.

Private-sector employment was up 170 in February. Industries showing the largest employment gains in February included private education and health services (+90 jobs, +1.2%); construction (+80 jobs, +2.7%); and professional and business services (+20 jobs, +0.6%).

Public-sector employment was up 50 jobs in February. Local government education employment added 50. Federal government and state government employment were both unchanged in February.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
