
Portland Metropolitan Area: December 2022

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.0% in December, essentially unchanged from November (3.9%). Approximately 56,800 area residents were unemployed; 9,300 more than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate rose to 4.5% and the national rate edged down to 3.5% in December.

Nonfarm employment rose by 5,700 jobs in December. November's estimates were revised up to a gain of 1,500 jobs.

The metro area made a complete jobs recovery as of July 2022. Since then, monthly job growth has averaged 3,800; below the post-recession bounce back, yet higher than the years prior to the onset of the pandemic.

Most broad industries added or lost jobs in line with seasonal expectations in December with



the exception of retail trade, which added several thousand jobs more than typical and compensated for a weak November. Financial activities also added more jobs than expected.

Over the past 12 months, nonfarm payrolls rose by 60,500 jobs, or 5.0%. Leisure and hospitality and construction are growing twice as fast as the overall economy; manufacturing and professional services are keeping pace; and trade, transportation, and warehousing are in the red.

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for January on Tuesday, Mar. 7.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
