
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## Portland Metropolitan Area: January 2023

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.1% in January, essentially unchanged from December (4.0%) and a year ago (4.1%). Approximately 61,900 area residents were unemployed; 6,500 more than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate held steady at 4.8% and the national rate edged down to 3.4% in January.

Employers added 7,600 jobs in January following a gain of 3,600 in December (seasonally adjusted).

Most broad industries added or lost jobs in line with seasonal expectations in January with a few exceptions. Private and public education typically shed jobs during the winter break, but this January's losses were significantly milder than usual. Financial activities added more jobs than typical for this time of year.



Newly revised numbers show the economy added slightly fewer jobs in 2022 than initially estimated. Overall, employment was revised down by 6,400 jobs (-0.5%). Manufacturing (-3,800), private education and health services (-3,300), and construction (-2,900) were revised down, more than offsetting upward revisions in retail trade (+2,600), financial activities (+1,500), and transportation and warehousing (+1,200). Revised numbers show the Portland metro region still recovering all of the pandemic recession job losses in 2022, although later (December 2022) than originally estimated (July 2022).

## **Next Press Release**

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for February on Tuesday, March 28.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
