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
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## Portland Metropolitan Area: October 2023

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.4% in October and lower than a year ago (4.4%). Approximately 45,300 area residents were unemployed; 12,200 less than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate was 3.6% and the national rate ticked up to 3.9%.

Employers cut 3,200 jobs in October following a gain of 4,800 jobs in September (seasonally adjusted). Monthly job growth has averaged 1,700 thus far in 2023, down from 2,600 in 2022 and similar to the years prior to the Pandemic Recession.

Both public and private education added far fewer jobs than typical in October. However, both sectors held on to more workers over the summer break than usual, perhaps explaining at least some of October's weak hiring.



Professional and business services declined by 1,000 jobs when it normally posts gains in October. Losses were entirely within the administrative and support services component, which includes temp help (-700 jobs), services to buildings (-500), and business support services.

Manufacturers cut 800 jobs, primarily in durable goods. All published components declined or were flat over the month.

Stronger than typical gains in construction and transportation and warehousing, and smaller seasonal losses in leisure and hospitality, partially offset these declines.

## Next Press Release

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for November on Wednesday, Dec 27.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
