

## Portland Metropolitan Area: February 2024

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.0% in February, up slightly from 3.8% in January and below the year-ago rate of 4.3%. Approximately 65,600 area residents were unemployed; 12,900 more than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate was 4.2% and the national rate ticked up to 3.9%.

Employers added 3,200 jobs in February (seasonally adjusted) following a gain of 500 jobs in January.

Construction bounced back from a weak January, adding twice the typical number of jobs for this time of year. Professional and business services also outperformed seasonal trends due entirely to a surge in temp help hiring. Health care and social assistance recorded solid gains across all published components.



Manufacturing continued its slow and

steady decline, shedding 700 jobs in a month that historically sees several hundred in gains. After recovering close to all pandemic losses by the fall of 2022, this sector has declined in all but one of the past 16 months.

Job growth in the metro area slowed throughout 2023 and despite gains in the first two months of 2024, employment has fallen slightly below year-ago levels (-13,000 jobs; -1.0%). Losses are broad based, with all but two major industries in the red: private education and health services, and government. Declines range from -9.4% (-2,600 jobs) in the information sector (which includes software publishing and telecommunications) to -1.7% (-700 jobs) in other services (which includes repair shops, religious organizations, drycleaners, and personal care services).

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for March on Tuesday, April 23.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
