

Portland Metropolitan Area: April 2024

The Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate was 4.1% in April, essentially unchanged from March and higher than the year-ago rate of 3.3%. Approximately 49,600 area residents were unemployed; 9,600 more than a year ago. The statewide unemployment rate was 4.2% and the national rate was little changed at 3.9%.

Employers added 3,100 jobs in April (seasonally adjusted) following a gain of 800 jobs in March.

Several major industries added more jobs than typical for this time of year. Construction gained more than double the expected number of jobs, making up for a lackluster start to the year. Manufacturing added 700 jobs when a gain of 200 to 300 is the norm for April. Every published component either gained jobs or was flat over the month. Finally, trade, transportation, and utilities added roughly 1,000 jobs more than



typical due largely to strength in the retail and transportation components.

Partially offsetting these gains were losses in professional and business services. Declines were broad-based as each published component shed jobs.

Leisure and hospitality added jobs in April, which is typical as the outdoor recreation season (e.g. golf) kicks into higher gear and restaurants ramp up after the winter lull. While this sector did indeed add jobs (+500), the gains fell well short of normal gains (+2,400).

All other broad industries added jobs in line with seasonal expectations.

Next Press Release

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for May on Tuesday, June 25.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
