## **Employment in Salem MSA (Marion and Polk Counties): January 2023**

## Salem MSA's Unemployment Rate Edges Up to 4.6%

The Salem MSA's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.6% in January, up from its revised rate of 4.5% in December. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in January was 4.8%, unchanged from its revised December rate of 4.8%.

Employment losses in the Salem MSA in January were smaller than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased by 1,700 jobs, when an employment decrease of 3,100 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased 1,400 between December and January. With January's gains, employment is up 3.4% or 6,000 jobs above the pre-pandemic employment level in February 2020.

Overall the private sector shed 1,500 jobs in January. The largest private-sector job losses in January were reported in trade, transportation, and utilities (-900 jobs, -2.9%); private education and health services (-400 jobs, -1.2%); and professional and business services (-300 jobs, -1.7%).

The only private-sector job gains in January were reported in leisure and hospitality (+300 jobs, +1.9%).

The public sector shed 200 jobs in January. Local government employment was down 300 jobs in January while state government added 100 jobs.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
