

Jobs Recovery




Overall jobs recovery is fast by historical standards



Lane Employment Change September 2019 to 2023





Job Vacancies and the Labor Market




2023 saw fewer job vacancies, but still elevated





Recent data shows a low jobseeker to vacancy ratio




Number of unemployed people per private job opening



Real wages for private nonfarm jobs have risen in recent months


Average Hourly Earnings
Oregon, 12-Month Moving Average, Adjusted for Inflation



When people switch jobs, they're getting higher wages






Average wages are lower in Lane County





Much of the wage gap comes from differences in job type




All major industries are projected to add jobs over 10 years





The vast majority of job openings are due to replacement








The workforce is diversifying rapidly in recent years


