




Bend-Redmond MSA Industry Employment Change Since Peak (February 2020 to November 2023)

November 2022 to November 2023, Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Employment





THE STARTING WAGE FOR VACANCIES AVERAGED \$23.81/HOUR IN THE SUMMER.

- ✓ The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was around \$23.81 per hour, an inflationadjusted increase of 4% from summer 2022, but a 14% decrease from spring 2023.
- ✓ The number of vacancies offering a starting wage below \$20 per hour decreased 34% over the year. The number of vacancies offering between \$20 and \$30 per hour decreased 12%, and vacancies paying above \$30 per hour increased 1%.













UNIQUE HELP WANTED ONLINE ADS DECREASED IN DECEMBER



- ✓ Unemployment rates declined or remained unchanged in 27 of Oregon's 36 counties in November 2023, and increased in nine.
- ✓ Crook County had Oregon's highest seasonally adjusted unemployment rate (5.7%) in November.
- ✓ Wheeler County registered the lowest unemployment rate (2.8%).



Current Rate (November 2023), Record High, and Record Low for Each County, Seasonally Adjusted





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


BEND-REDMOND MSA LABOR FORCE

NUMBER OF EMPLOYED


Number of Employed in the **Bend-Redmond MSA**, 1990-2023

Number of Unemployed in the **Bend-Redmond MSA**, 1990-2023



Oregon Civilian Labor Force, Seasonally Adjusted





(Job Openings with Private Employers, 2013-2023)




- ✓ Oregon's unemployed-tovacancy ratio has been below pre-pandemic levels for the past two years.
- ✓ Oregon had 1.2 unemployed per job vacancy in summer 2023, up from 1.0 in summer 2022 but still much lower than the peak of 5.7 in May 2020.




